#### WALK IN THE WOODS

#### FEBRUARY 15, 2022 TUESDAY JOHNSTON WOODS MCDONALD TN

#### **ROCK CREEK IN LITTLE FROG WILDERNESS**

#### FEBRUARY 19, 2022 SATURDAY

We will meet at Thunder Rock Campground parking lot at 9 am for the quick car shuttle to the trailhead. Approximately eight miles beginning at Rock Creek trailhead on Hwy 64 and returning downhill via the Dry Pond Lead Trail (Benton MacKaye Trail). There is a small stream crossing at Laurel Creek, which is usually easy; but crossing Rock Creek will require fording the cold-water stream. Water shoes and hiking poles for balance are highly recommended. Along the way, there should be great views of the nearby mountains as the trail goes up the side of Panther Knob and into the beautiful Pressley Cove where Rock Creek is encountered. The trail is considered strenuous due to the length of the hike and several moderate climbs. The hike will be canceled in the event of snow/ice on the roads.
