LOWRY TOP OVERLOOK

MARCH 3. 2022 THURSDAY

DRY POND LEAD TRAIL/SECTION 12 OF THE BENTON MACKAYE TRAIL

MARCH 5, 2022 SATURDAY

We will meet at the Thunder Rock Campground parking lot at 9 am. We will hike part of Section 12 of the Benton MacKaye Trail—commonly known as the Dry Pond Lead Trail— for a total mileage of approximately nine miles. There is in excess of 1700 feet of elevation gain within the first four miles so I am rating this hike as strenuous. In fact, the first four miles are practically all uphill. There are normally great winter views of Brock Mountain, the Ocoee Gorge and sometimes Big Frog Mountain on this trail which meanders along the NW boundary of the Little Frog Mountain Wilderness Area for much of the hike. MOUNT PISGAH BACKPACK

MAY 3 - 7, 2022 TUESDAY - SATURDAY

This will be a backpacking hike of the iconic Art Loeb Trail in the Shining Rock Wilderness in North Carolina near Asheville. The total hike is about 31 miles and is considered strenuous. There are scenic views across several miles of peaks with elevations above 6000 feet. A shuttle service will be required and will cost about \$30 per person including the campsite the first night (Mountain High Shuttles, Joel Kitchens, 828-553-0683 and Davidson River Campground). Hike is limited to eight (8) people maximum.

May 3, Day 1 – Drive to Davidson River Campground (about 3.5 hours) and camp the first night there.

May 4, Day 2 – Shuttle to Camp Daniel Boone. Starting elevation about 3500 feet. Hike 7.9 miles to campsite elevation about 5800 feet, gain of about 2300 feet.

May 5, Day 3 – Hike 7.3 miles to Deep Gap Shelter at mile 15.2, 4500 feet elevation, loss of about 1300 feet.

May 6, Day 4 – Hike 6.2 miles to Butter Gap Shelter at mile 21.4, elevation 3100 feet, loss of about 1400 feet.

May 7, Day 5 – Hike 8.7 miles to Davidson River Campground, elevation 2100 feet, loss of about 1000 feet. Drive back to Cleveland.

- MINUTES

Meeting Minutes 2-10-22

President James Anderson called the meeting to order after the potluck dinner was finished. He mentioned there were no minutes from the last meeting as it was our annual planning meeting and the planning results for hikes and other activities are posted on the Club website.

Our Treasurer, Jennifer Schroll, presented the monthly financial report. She reported the Club checking account balance is currently \$1777.50. Since the last report we spent \$72.44 on club business cards, \$26.66 on potluck dinner supplies, and made a \$50 donation to the Wesley Memorial Food Pantry for the use of their church for the January planning meeting. A motion to approve the report was made by Jack, seconded by Marc, and the motion carried unanimously.

James reported on his recent hike on the Childer's Creek section of the BMT and Jack gave an overview of the Lookout Wild Film Festival held in Chattanooga.

The following upcoming hikes were announced:

Jack will be leading the visit and hike this coming Saturday to the Sequoyah Birthplace Museum in Vonore. James will lead the Walk in the Woods on 2-15. Randy will lead a hike on Rock Creek or someplace else on 2-19. Jack will lead a hike to Lowery Top on 2-24. Randy will lead a hike up Oswald Dome on 3-5 and Sue will lead a hike on Brush Creek on 3-8.

James also brought up the topic that we may want to consider making other arrangements for our meeting space in Etowah. Tonight we were supposed to meet at the Senior Center as we had in the past but no one ever came to open the facility and let us in, nor did they answer any calls from Ruth as to what was happening. After waiting for awhile we were able to move over to Wesley Memorial Church and meet there. James mentioned we may want to consider changing our future meetings to the Church. He asked Ruth and Clayton to explore that with the Church to see if that might be a possibility and that we could discuss it at the next meeting.
